Great Educational Sessions and Mini Conferences at the 2015 SC AgriBiz & Farm Expo

Florence, S.C. – Plan to spend two days at the 3rd Annual SC AgriBiz & Farm Expo and take in the two mini conferences as well as all the other educational sessions they are offering this year.

On Wednesday, join Jackie Moore the SC Agritourism Director for the SC Agritourism Conference and Association Meeting. Jackie along with other industry professionals will inform you on the value and potential that agritourism can bring to your farm no matter the size. Then check out the Combine Optimization Clinics that your preferred brands will conduct at their booths from 10:30-11:30am. There will also be a Confined Animal Manure Management (Camm) training session from 12:30-2pm and the Hay Equipment Optimization Clinics from 2:30-3:30pm. The educational sessions for Wednesday will conclude with the Precision Ag Data Management Clinic from 5:15-6:30pm. It will feature “Decision Making Using Crop Yield Data” and “Data Imagery Potential with Agricultural USA”.

Also on Wednesday, Clemson CAFLS will host the SC AgriBiz Youth Day* from 10am-2pm for those young agriculture enthusiasts. This will be a great opportunity for them to get some insight into the many different aspects of agriculture and the different companies and groups that are involved. They will also get a better understanding of how to get prepared for a career in agriculture.

Stay for Thursday and get a full day of Exhibitor Demonstrations. Plus the Small Farmer Mini Conference will be held from 10am-2:30pm, which will focus on Resources and Markets for Emerging Agricultural and Food Entrepreneurs. There will be a special guest speaker featured by SC Farm Bureau from 10:30-11:30am. Then at 2:30pm join Buz Kloot for “Benefits of Improving Soil Health.”

If you’d like to spend a little more time in town, join them on Tuesday for a First Responders Rescue Training session from 1-3pm. Then come out on Friday for SC Farm Bureau’s Educational Symposium “Agriculture’s Future – Trends, Technology, and Issues.” These extra events are taking place in conjunction with the Expo.
